Like many, when I lost my job at the beginning of the pandemic, I wasn't sure how my family was going to survive. As someone new to the United States, I started questioning my decision to move my family here and whether we would have been better off staying in Syria. My worries were alleviated when a generous case worker at ACCESS took on our case and treated us like we were family. She led me to help that I didn't know was available. Thanks to our ACCESS case worker, we received unemployment benefits, food and basic needs, and even got furniture for our home and clothes and school supplies for our kids.

It was only because of ACCESS that we were able to keep our house and furnish it, so it finally felt like home. Our kids felt secure enough about our future to focus on school, and I was able to commute to a job that our case worker helped me get. ACCESS is truly sent from God.

COVID RESPONSE

In collaboration with WSU, Wayne Health and later, Ford X, ACCESS was one of the first organizations across the state to provide drive-thru and mobile COVID testing, administering over 16,000 tests to vulnerable communities.





Provided approximately **559,000** hours of remote learning through supplemental educational programming.

Opened our ACCESS Detroit Center, one of only eight career centers in the area chosen to offer critical inperson services to struggling job seekers during COVID.

◆ Provided \$3.2 million in emergency relief funding to struggling families, covering costs of housing, food assistance, utilities and other essential services.

AANM screened the classic Egyptian film Days and Nights (Ayaam wa Layaali) starring Abdel Halim Hafez at the Ford-Wyoming Drive-in Theatre, providing relief from the isolating effects of COVID and bringing the community together.



EDUCATION




I went into high school wanting to make friends and memories, but COVID stole that away from us. I didn't even get to say goodbye to my friends and teachers.

Even on the hardest days of this pandemic, my teachers at ACCESS have been there for me. They check in on us and provide us with extra support on assignments. They understand that virtual learning isn't easy and they never make us feel bad if we have Wi-Fi issues or have to share a room or computer with our siblings who are learning online, too.

Sometimes I ask myself, "How much longer will COVID last? When can I see my friends again?" At those times, I try to remember how grateful I am for the ACCESS staff and teachers who have done everything they can to give us back what COVID took away from us and who make me feel like I can accomplish anything.

EDUCATION



Provided free and accessible virtual programming including webinars, town halls, workshops and film screenings to nearly 70,000 participants, keeping the community connected, informed and engaged.

 CAAP awarded 53 scholarships totaling
 \$151,500 to students pursuing degrees in diverse fields of study across the U.S.

Prioritized accessibility through bilingual and American Sign Language (ASL) programming and resources for Arabic speakers and the hearing-impaired around topics such as COVID, small business relief, the 2020 Census and election, and more.

Helped prepare students for the school year by providing nearly 12,500 youth with immunizations, physicals and school kits.





■ Expanded prevention efforts in response to skyrocketing substance use numbers, sharing critical resources and engaging community members in virtual programming around topics such as prevention and advocating against stigma and health disparities.

ECONOMIC MOBILITY



When the pandemic hit, I felt like my business was falling apart. Sales were down, my employees were getting sick and I was falling behind on bills. I worried about providing for my family, especially for my brother in Lebanon who was suffering after the explosion in Beirut. For the first time in my life, I couldn't help the people I love.


When ACCESS gave me the small business grant, I felt like somebody caught me when I was falling. The funds helped me pay my employees and purchase PPE to protect them against COVID while serving clients. I was able to pay rent and keep my bakery alive. Although our ma'amoul (date filled cookies) are not going to weddings and gatherings because of COVID, they still bring hope and joy to families at home during this difficult time. This grant gave me the hope to believe 'yes, I'm going to survive.'

ECONOMIC MOBILITY

To help small businesses survive during the economic crisis caused by COVID, ACCESS granted \$150,000 to 60 small business owners in Dearborn.

Helped field over 38,000 calls to assist in filing, certification and technical support for unemployment applicants.






Over \$130,000 was granted to national Arab American community-based organizations by NNAAC and CAAP for capacity building and COVID relief.

◀ Facing a crisis within a crisis while being isolated with their abusers under COVID stay-at-home orders, ACCESS raised over \$216,000 to empower domestic violence survivors, helping them with housing, utilities, childcare and other basic needs.

CAAP's Teen Grantmaking Initiative (TGI) raised funds to support three metro Detroit organizations with programs specializing in racial healing, domestic violence prevention and youth empowerment including Haven, InsideOut Literary Arts and Detroit Heals Detroit.



HEALTH



Serving communities on the west side of Detroit is difficult because our neighborhoods have been overlooked. When COVID hit, it introduced overwhelming challenges to our ability to service those in need. Restrictions around gathering made it difficult to organize our efforts and easier for our folks to be forgotten.

Our collaboration with ACCESS to offer free and accessible COVID testing within our neighborhood helped us address the immediate, urgent needs of our communities. To so many of our residents, access to testing and reliable COVID information was sadly limited. This collaboration gave our communities connection, visibility and safety.

This is the kind of partnership and commitment it takes to build a better future for everyone, where no community or neighborhood gets left behind.


HEALTH



◆ Provided 356,000 meals to youth and families, including nutritional food packages and food vouchers, all purchased from local vendors to empower small businesses.

Hosted COVID webinar series, inviting respected health experts to provide critical COVID education and awareness to immigrant and Arabic-speaking populations.

Provided nearly 34,000 in-person and telehealth services in the areas of greatest need: substance use prevention, domestic violence prevention and individual and family counseling.





◆ CAAP raised over \$500,000 through its Disaster Relief Fund to support relief efforts in Lebanon and partnered with the American Task Force on Lebanon (ATFL) on their Lebanon Relief Project, which has airlifted over \$30 million in medical and pharmaceutical supplies to Beirut in the aftermath of the Aug. 4 explosion.

I had never voted before immigrating to the U.S. in 2014. I was convinced that my voice wouldn't change anything until I realized that my indifference hurt people who looked like me. The Muslim Ban was definitely a wake-up call for me.

ACCESS hosted Your Voice, Your Vote, Our Future, a virtual voting rights town hall combatting election misinformation and mistrust, featuring Michigan Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson and Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel.

◆ ACCESS' Campaign to TAKE ON HATE offered educational web series centered on the social, economic and health disparities of COVID and combatting anti-Blackness.

Continuing its mission to provide the community with collective healing and social connection in a time of isolation, AANM held an event titled Body Watani: soul speak, an outdoor drive-in dance performance led by AANM artist-in-residence, Leila Awadallah. Proceeds from this event went towards ACCESS' Domestic Violence Prevention Program.



OUR STORY



What began out of a simple storefront in 1971 to assist the Arab immigrant population is now the largest Arab American community nonprofit in the nation. With over 120 programs focused on youth, education, community health, workforce development, emergency services, philanthropy, activism and the arts, 10 locations in Southeast Michigan and three national institutions—the Arab American National Museum (AANM), the Center for Arab American Philanthropy (CAAP) and the National Network for Arab American Communities (NNAAC)—everything ACCESS does is to advance the social, health and economic well-being of individuals and families.

Guided by our vision of a just and equitable society, anchored in our mission of empowerment, and founded on the belief that a community must first have its basic needs met before it can be empowered to impact social change, ACCESS has continued to honor its Arab American heritage, while helping to change our world, one person at a time.

The Arab American National Museum (AANM) is the first and only museum of its kind in the U.S. devoted to recording and sharing the Arab American experience. Since opening in 2005, AANM's mission has been to document, preserve and present the history, culture and contributions of Arab Americans. AANM builds community through the arts by showcasing our nation's cultural diversity in thoughtful and impacting ways.



The Center for Arab American Philanthropy (CAAP) is a national community foundation dedicated to building vibrant societies by uniting and strengthening the collective power of Arab American giving. CAAP shapes perceptions about Arab Americans by highlighting their generous heritage and exceptional contributions to society.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERS

2020 brought with it an unprecedented, virtually unknown and very aggressive virus that swept across the world and into our lives, changing us radically and indefinitely. Along with this devastating global pandemic, the year also ushered in an economic recession, a historic election and a monumental social uprising against racial injustice.

How did we respond to a tumultuous year that ravaged millions, pushed many of us to our breaking point, exposed the jarring social and economic gaps in our society, and fiercely tested our collective integrity, compassion and humanity? We did what we always do. We rolled up our sleeves and got to work. As numbers of those being infected with COVID began to surge, we rapidly formulated a plan that allowed us to support our communities, balancing the need to protect staff and clients, while ensuring our ability to expand and safely provide critical services.

Though our engagement with the community looked different, we remained at the forefront as a service provider. ACCESS was one of the first organizations in Michigan to provide free COVID testing to first responders, healthcare workers and vulnerable communities, including being the FIRST to offer these services through statewide mobile units. Additionally, we launched an Emergency Basic Needs Fund, helping provide food and basic needs support directly to families; we helped keep the doors of small local businesses and organizations across the U.S. open with critical relief funding; we expanded our impact internationally by raising funds to support those impacted by the devastating explosion in Beirut last August; we delivered virtual educational programming, hot meals and COVID-conscious care packages to thousands of underserved families throughout Southeast Michigan; with the rise of domestic violence during the pandemic, we also stepped in to provide support to 640 domestic violence survivors and their families; we created a space for our communities to engage with and heal through virtual cultural and arts programming; we engaged nearly 1 million contacts and mobilized voters around a historic election—contributing to the greatest voter turnout in U.S. history; and we led the 2020 Census effort at both the state and national levels, elevating voices in our community and others.

We know that, while this pandemic has affected everyone, it has disproportionately impacted vulnerable populations—the same populations ACCESS has worked with for the past half century. While we continue our work to fulfill the immediate basic needs of those we serve, we are also focused on long-term, sustainable solutions. We remain committed to our promise of institutional leadership that promotes organizational sustainability. As a changemaker, ACCESS is not only bound to the present but more so to the future, as we work to create ongoing ripples of hope for humanity that we are confident will persevere long after us.
