# UPLIFTING ARAB AMERICAN VOICES IN GOVERNMENT

---

The Arab American Leadership Fund (AALF), housed at the Center for Arab American Philanthropy (CAAP), makes it possible for emerging Arab American public servants to hold summer internships in state or federal government agencies, on Capitol Hill, and in other key public service institutions in Washington, D.C.

The AALF allowed Sief Salameh — a second year Public Policy master’s student at the University of Chicago — to intern with the office of Congresswoman Marie Newman (Chicago’s 3rd Congressional District).

For Sief, the funding gave him a unique opportunity to work alongside legislators and policy makers. “The fellowship gave me the financial and professional support to enter the congressional space,” he said. “It also helped me break some of the systemic barriers that exist for students who come from immigrant and low-income backgrounds. When you look at the numbers, less than eleven percent of Congressional staff are actually folks of color... so it’s really important for folks like me to be in that space and to voice our experiences and advocate for legislation that empowers the communities we come from.”

# INNOVATIVE PROGRAM INSPIRES ART AND ARTISTS



Works such as this are a testament to the Museum’s role and responsibility as an incubator for art by and about Arab Americans, locally and nationally.

The residency welcomes diverse local, national and international artists with creative and impactful projects related to the Museum’s mission, vision and values.

The Arab American National Museum (AANM) is a hub for Arab American art and artists, locally and nationally, and no program exemplifies this distinction as much as Artists + Residents. This innovative program provides a unique opportunity for established and emerging artists to cultivate and grow their work while being immersed in a supportive environment that encourages artist collaboration and civic engagement in metro Detroit.



In the past year, AANM premiered new works by artists-in-residence that have gone on to have exposure and audiences far beyond the Museum walls. Of note is *EVE — A Palestinian Necropastoral* by George Abraham and Fargo Tbakhi. Developed during their residency, the poetic duo performed an excerpt of the loosely adapted Milton epic, *Paradise Lost*, in December 2021. In the following months, George and Fargo worked with the Public Programming team at AANM to apply for and were granted a National Performance Network (NPN) Creation Fund to continue crafting *EVE*.

# COUNT MENA IN!

This was a pivotal year for the National Network for Arab American Communities (NNAAC) ongoing work to bring recognition for Middle Eastern and North African (MENA) communities.

The issue is clear: Middle Eastern and North Africans have a right to be recognized and counted by the U.S. Census and the OMB (Office of Management and Budget). Being federally recognized means that the interests of the millions of Americans from the Middle East and North Africa are considered and protected, and their voices are heard, rather than being invisible in the halls of Congress.

In 2022, NNAAC and its member organizations continued to push for the equitable inclusion of individuals and families from the MENA region across all federal agencies. Several agencies have now established a MENA category, including the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Treasury Department. More importantly, the OMB has committed to revising the data standards that currently place people from the MENA region into the white category by the summer of 2024. This is a momentous step in ensuring that MENA populations are counted in the 2030 census.



NNAAC is also working to ensure that the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) begins collecting data on the MENA community, a necessary step in health equity for MENA populations. NNAAC partnered with Senator Gary Peters, Representatives Rashida Tlaib, Debbie Dingell, Anna Eshoo and Robin Kelly to introduce the Health Equity and MENA Community Inclusion Act, legislation that would incorporate MENA inclusion across the HHS.

NNAAC members are working tirelessly for MENA inclusion at the local level, with ongoing efforts in Texas, California, Pennsylvania, New York, Illinois and several other states.

## OVERCOMING ADDICTION ONE DAY AT A TIME

**“I feel like I’m really back to being myself again. It’s been a long time.”**

Devin Thompson has been battling addiction for the better part of the past 20 years, after being prescribed opiates for a work-related back injury in the early 2000s. He tried countless rehabilitation programs, but like so many battling addiction, he would relapse. This kept happening until he found the ACCESS Sterling Heights clinic in July 2021.

And then, things changed. “The prior two and a half years before I came here, things really got out of hand... I was in the hospital more than I was home,” he said. “Coming to ACCESS changed everything for me.”

Devin credits both the medication regime, the staff and the treatment approach for his success. “This has been a lifesaver for me,” he adds. “I can think clearly again and am making new friends. I know there’s always a possibility of relapse, but I choose not to and now, I have people in my life for the first time who are truly helping me.”

# ACCESS TO ESTABLISH FULL-SERVICE SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER TREATMENT CENTER

## \$18-million capital campaign will fund state-of-the-art facility

The 45,000 square foot ACCESS Recovery Center will offer a community-centered approach to prevention, education and healing for individuals across southeast Michigan. It will house a wide range of wrap-around services, including a crisis stabilization unit, inpatient detoxification, short-term residential care and outpatient treatment. Patients will have access to medication-assisted treatment, intensive clinical counseling, recovery support services and care coordination through an individualized recovery plan, as well as psychiatric services.

The Center will be linguistically and culturally inclusive, with a unique focus on the needs of the Arab American community that our agency has served for over 50 years.

“ACCESS has been addressing the drug epidemic through various programs for more than 10 years, but we recognized the need for our community to come together with more determination than ever in response to this deeply troubling epidemic that has already claimed too many lives,” said ACCESS President and CEO Maha Freij.

## WHERE THERE IS HOPE

### **Cynthia found a chosen family — and optimism for her future — at the Hope House**

Depression is a dark disease, and Cynthia lived with hers for years without a strong support system. She knew she needed treatment and turned to ACCESS to find a therapist, who then referred her to the ACCESS Hope House.

“I thought I’d see what it was like, and a light went off,” Cynthia says. “My heart just opened, and my creative juices started flowing.”

When she first visited ACCESS Hope House, Cynthia was asked about her passions, goals, hopes and dreams. That’s because the community-based membership provides members with opportunities to learn new skills and expand existing ones.

Designed for people with serious mental illness, the Hope House gives members daily structure while they’re in treatment, helping them regain the independence needed to become more functional and return to work or school.

Just five months after joining the Hope House, Cynthia channeled her interests into making jewelry and other items and creating a brand called “Lovable DC Star,” along with five other Hope House members. They make jewelry, recycle and upgrade glassware, recycle furniture and create other items that the Hope House has helped secure vendor opportunities for.



ACCESS Hope House also provides job placement support, educational and community engagement opportunities, including English-language courses, computer literacy, post-secondary education support and GED preparation.

“It means so much to have a place I can go where we feel cared for and are seen for the unique individuals we are,” Cynthia says. “Hope House has given me the life I always wanted but never had.”

## CREATING SUSTAINABILITY

### How ACCESS helped one woman grow a strong, environmentally friendly business

Tamara Shanay Lincoln established Lincoln Stone Paper, which manufactures notebooks from stone, in January 2022, and her concept had the potential to be a rock-solid business. She needed some guidance and turned to ACCESS' Business Development Program.

"Once I started working with ACCESS, it was like a domino effect," Tamara says. "They put together all the puzzle pieces, which I never could have done without them."

Tamara took advantage of the full range of ACCESS' Business Development Program's services to bolster her newly established business. She participated in a seven-week entrepreneurship training, attended multiple business workshops and continues working with a dedicated mentor through the program's 1:1 business coaching.

The program taught her how to create a business plan, establish financial projections and budgets, and apply for grants, including one she received from ProsperUS Detroit.

Thanks to ACCESS, Tamara has been a vendor at the Dearborn Homecoming festival and other venues. "Because I'm part of the ACCESS ecosystem," Tamara says, "I went from being someone who creates to someone who really understands all the different aspects of running a business."

# EMPOWERMENT THROUGH ESL

## Learning English opens pathways to citizenship, higher education and more

Ever since Shaima Mohamed and her family moved to the U.S. from Yemen in 2014, she yearned to learn English. It was important not just to her — so she could become a U.S. citizen, navigate daily tasks and communicate with others – but also to be able to help her children with their own education.

As a mom, finding a place to study English as a Second Language (ESL) wasn't easy. Then she discovered the ESL program at ACCESS, where she learned English in one year starting in fall 2018.

"It's amazing," Shaima explains. "They taught me English, had someone there to care for my kids and even helped me get my GED."

Shaima also attended parenting classes at ACCESS, giving her the confidence to apply to Henry Ford College, where she's working towards an associate degree in Computer Science.

Now a U.S. citizen, Shaima was very impressed with ACCESS' level of ESL courses. "They helped so many learn English, making the American Dream of earning citizenship a possibility."

Shaima is excited about what the future holds for her and her children. "My children get a broader view — we can speak to each other in two languages," she says. "And for me, I love learning as much as I can."

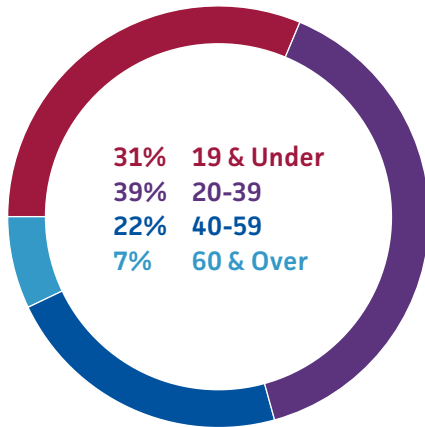

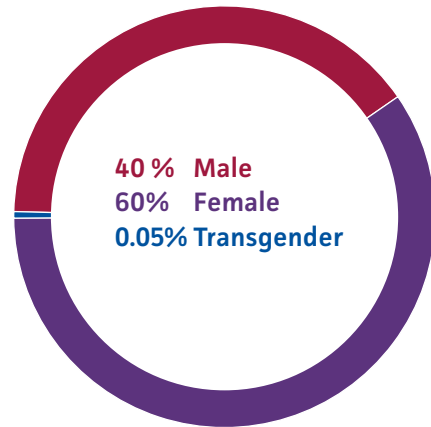

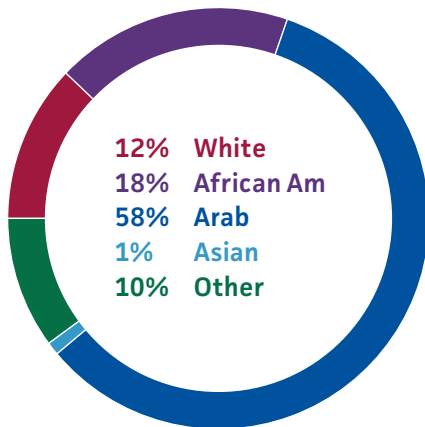
**CLIENTS BY AGE**



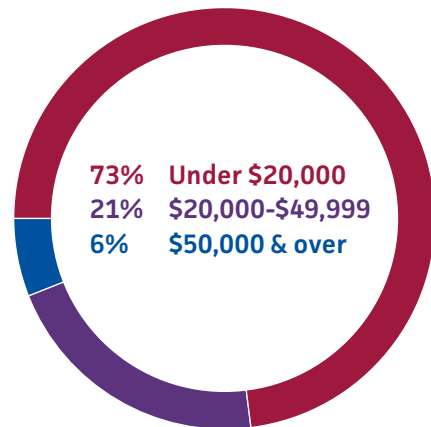
**CLIENTS BY GENDER**



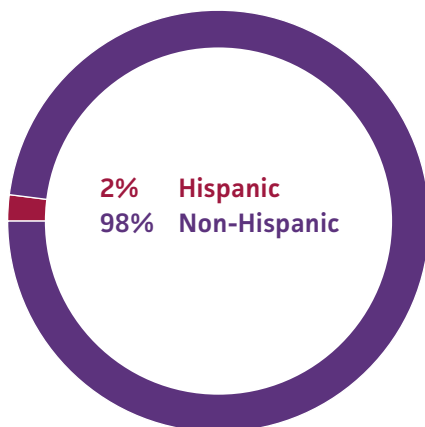
**CLIENTS BY RACE, ORIGIN, OR DESCENT**



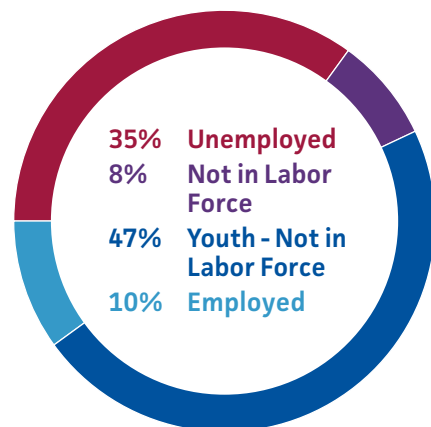
**CLIENTS BY HOUSEHOLD INCOME\***

**CLIENTS BY EMPLOYMENT STATUS\***



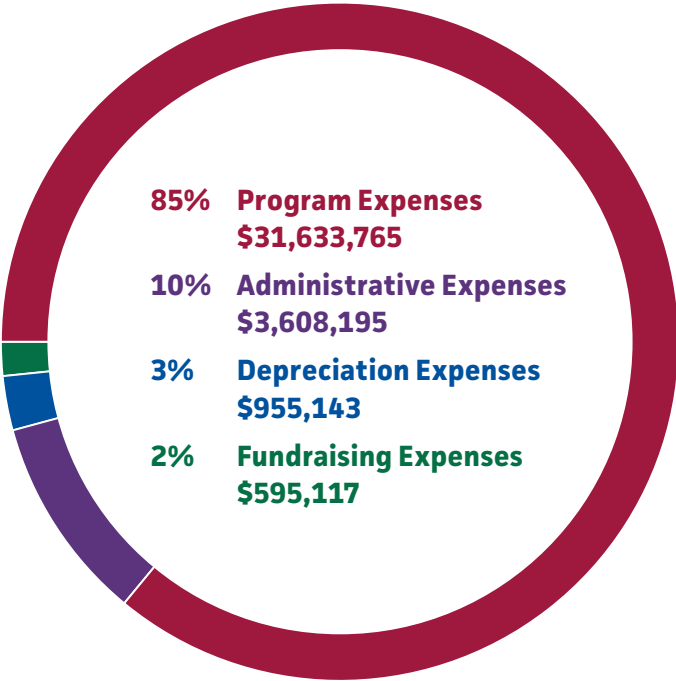
